Friday is Good Friday and a day of Fasting and Abstinence

Holy Week WHAT IS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF EACH DAY?

On Palm Sunday, Jesus' arrival to Jerusalem is remembered. Catholics can participate in processions with blessed olive branches or palms. From Holy Monday to Wednesday there are no special events. **Holy Thursday** commemorates Jesus' Last Supper, in which He instituted the sacraments of the Eucharist and Holy Orders. During the Mass celebrated on this day, the priest practices the rite of foot washing. Mass cannot be celebrated on Good Friday nor Holy Saturday, since these are days of mourning the death of Christ. **On Good Friday** there is special liturgy of the Word Adoration of the Cross and Holy Communion. **On Holy Saturday** the church is silent until later that night, when the Easter Vigil is celebrated. It is common that new persons are baptized into the Catholic faith on this night. Finally, the Resurrection of Christ is remembered on Easter Sunday and is celebrated at Mass that morning.

The Scottish Government is consulting on a proposal to end 'conversion practices' in Scotland. The Catholic Church unequivocally condemns violent, abusive, coercive practices. The proposals, however, risk criminalising themainstream pastoral work of churches and parental guidance given lovingly and in good faith. Note about Hospitals - We have Catholic Chaplains assigned, but they can only act when the patient declares as a Roman Catholic and asks the Catholic Chaplain to be notified. So, communication on this matter when someone is admitted to hospital is essential. Please inform the Hospital staff that you are Catholic and you would like to see a Catholic chaplain. If you are to receive major surgery, it is recommended that you receive the Sacrament of Anointing prior to admission. If anyone has become housebound and would like Communion at home or would like to ask for the Sacrament for the sick, please contact Fr Marcin.

It is a very special way of remembering a loved one, celebrating an anniversary, making a petition or an act of thanksgiving or sharing in the feasts and seasons of the Church year. Customary Mass stipend is not for offered prayers but voluntary contribution towards up keeping of our clergy.
